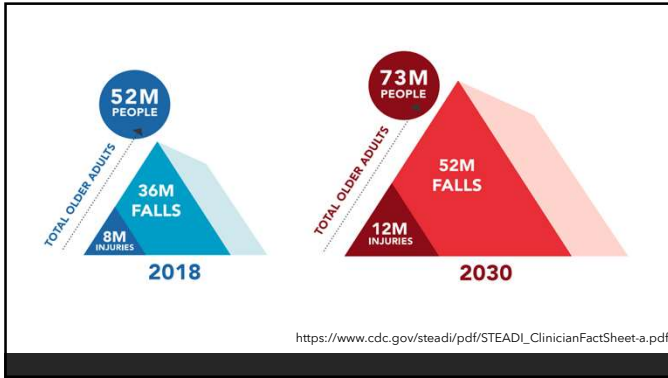
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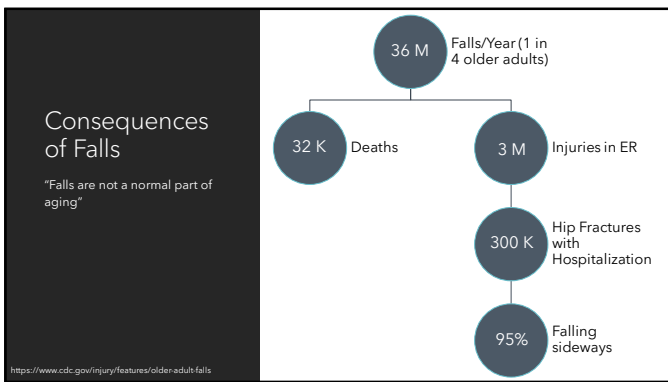
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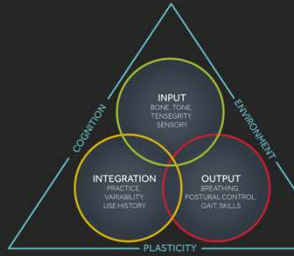
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- At risk for falls**

 - Ankle Instability

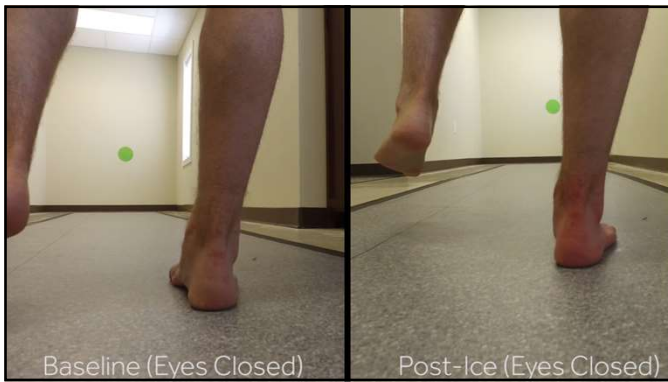
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Why do they fall?

- Postural control stability in the lateral plane
- Decreased trunk mobility and control to counter perturbations
- Impaired lower limb proprioception
- Reduced reaction time
- Reduced quadriceps strength
- Fear of falling

Need more frontal plane support than foot orthotic

Ataxia

Gait abnormality	Stage 1 Charcot Foot





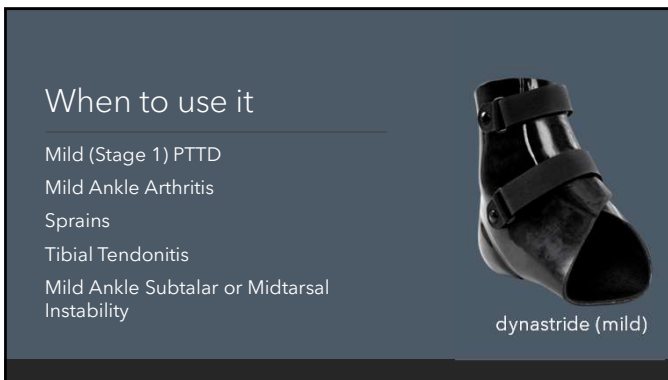
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When to use it

- Charcot Foot (Stage 3)


